





Trimmed with Braid — jumper from 3 ozs

MATERIALS: 3 ozs. Patons Beehive Fingering 2-ply, Patonised. A pair each No. 12 and No. 11 "Beehive" needles. Four small buttons. Three yards of $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch wide white ruched braid. Medium crochet hook. 1 yard $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch wide petersham ribbon.

MEASUREMENTS: To fit 32–34-inch bust; length from top of shoulders, 18 inches.

TENSION: $8\frac{1}{2}$ sts. to an inch.

BACK

With No. 12 needles cast on 120 sts. and work 4 inches k. 1, p. 1 rib. Change to No. 11 needles and stocking-stitch, increasing on first row thus:—K. 7, * increase in next stitch, k. 6; repeat from * to last stitch, k. 1 (136 sts.). Continue straight in stocking-stitch until back measures 10 inches, ending with a purl row. Mark each end of last row with a length of coloured thread as this is start of armholes.

Continue straight in stocking-stitch until back measures 14 inches. Here divide for back opening. K. 68, turn and leave remaining stitches on a spare needle. Work straight on these stitches until back measures $17\frac{1}{2}$ inches. With right side facing, shape shoulder by casting off 10 sts. at beginning of next and following 4 alternate rows, armhole edge. Cast off remaining stitches.

Rejoin wool at centre and work remaining 68 sts. to correspond.

FRONT

Work exactly as for back until front measures 14 inches. Now continue straight over all stitches until front measures 16 inches. Shape neck as follows:—k. 56 and leave on a spare needle, cast off 24, k. 56. Continue on last 56 sts., decreasing 1 stitch at neck edge on every row until 50 sts. remain. Work a few rows straight until front measures $17\frac{1}{2}$ inches. With wrong side facing, shape shoulder by casting off 10 sts. at beginning of next and following 4 alternate rows, armhole edge.

Rejoin wool to remaining stitches at neck edge and work to correspond.

TO MAKE UP

Press work on wrong side under a damp cloth. Join shoulder seams. Turn under a narrow hem along *please turn to page 20*

Snug idea—

MOST of you have been making rugs for some months, and will be collecting odds and ends in various shades. Here is a grand way of using up those tantalising left-overs—a quickly made rug, knitted on thick needles, which looks really warm and friendly in front of the living-room fire. For country dwellers it is perfect in a cottage room. You can make your rug any size you like, and it is best not to bother about a colour-scheme if you are using left-overs—the result is much more effective if you take them at random and don't attempt to control the arrangement.

The original used about 5 lbs. oddments Turkey Rug Wool and a pair of No. 2 "Beehive" needles; this made a finished size approximately 30 x 54 inches, excluding fringe. You can see the size of the stitch in the close-up. If you want to make a different size, remember to cast on an even number of stitches.

A new length of wool is joined in on every row—breaking off wool at end of row, leaving 4 inches free. When a new length is begun, leave 4 inches of wool and knot together with the end left from previous row, thus forming a fringe. This applies to every row even if you are working more than 1 row in a particular colour as the knotting tightens sides and forms fringe.
