

Spring in

Simple jumper, quickly knitted in Purple Heather Fingering, 4-ply, a tough, inexpensive wool, ideal for this type of all-purpose jumper. With suits or a skirt at the office, or with slacks or tweeds in the country, whatever the occasion you have a simple, classic sweater, quickly and cheaply made.



this smart sweater is perfect with suits

MATERIALS: 9 ozs. Patons Purple Heather Fingering 4-ply. A pair each No. 12 and No. 10 "Beehive" needles.

MEASUREMENTS: To fit 33-35-inch bust; length from top of shoulders, 20 inches; sleeve seam, 4½ inches.

TENSION: 7 sts. and 9 rows to an inch.

FRONT

With No. 12 needles cast on 111 sts. and work 5 inches k. 1, p. 1 rib, rows on right side having a k. 1 at each end. Change to No. 10 needles and pattern as follows:—1st row: Right side facing, * k. 6, p. 1; repeat from * to

last 6 sts., k. 6.
2ND ROW: Purl.
Repeat these 2 rows for 1½ inches.

Continue in pattern, increasing at each end of next and every following 8th row until there are 119 sts. Work straight until front measures 12 inches at centre. NEXT row: Pattern 48, cast off 23, pattern to end. Leave first 48 sts. on a spare needle.

With wrong side facing, shape armhole by casting off 6 sts. at beginning of next row, then k. 2 tog. at this edge on every alternate row, 4 times. Work straight until armhole measures 2 inches. Cast off loosely.

Rejoin wool at neck edge and work remaining 48 sts. to correspond.

Yoke: With No. 12 needles cast on 170 sts. and work 2 rows k. 1, p. 1 rib. NEXT ROW: Rib 114, turn. NEXT ROW: Rib 58, turn. NEXT ROW: Rib 68, turn. NEXT ROW: Rib 78, turn. NEXT ROW: Rib 88, turn. NEXT ROW: Rib 98, turn. NEXT ROW: Rib to end. Now rib back over all sts.

Continue in rib until side edge measures 3½ inches, then cast off 16 sts. at beginning of next 2 rows. NEXT ROW: Rib 52 and leave on a spare

needle, cast off 34 (this is cast-off edge for back of neck), rib to end. Rib back, then shape shoulder by k. 2 tog. at beginning of 5th and every following 6th row until 45 sts. remain. Cast off in rib.

Rejoin wool at shoulder edge and work remaining 52 sts. to correspond.

BACK

Work exactly as for Front until Back measures 12 inches. With right side facing, shape armholes by casting off 6 sts. at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at each end of next and every alternate row until 99 sts. remain. Work straight in pattern until back measures 19 inches, then with right side facing, shape shoulders by casting off 8 sts. at beginning of next 8 rows. Cast off.

SLEEVES

With No. 10 needles cast on 72 sts. and work 1 inch k. 1, p. 1 rib. Continue in rib, increasing at each end of next and every following 4th row until there are 86 sts. Work straight until sleeve measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Shape top by casting off 4 sts. at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at each end of next and every alternate row until 40 sts. remain, then at each end of every row until 20 sts. remain. Cast off.

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CUTWORK SET...

Use white cotton on a soft shade of grey linen for this early-morning set and its crisp freshness will be a pleasant start to the day. You need $\frac{3}{4}$ yard 36-inch wide silver-grey linen and 13 skeins of Peri-Lusta Stranded Cotton in white.

Transfer No. 394, price 11d. post-free from STITCHCRAFT Ltd., Great West Road, Brentford, Middlesex, gives you the design for one side of the cosy, and both ends of the traycloth.

EMBROIDERY

Mark off an oblong of linen for the traycloth, $13 \times 19\frac{1}{2}$ inches, fit the two borders from transfer and iron off at each end; connect with double pencil lines down each side, then cut out oblong. Cut two pieces for back and front of cosy, each 15×11 inches; iron off transfer in centre of one piece.

Six strands of cotton are used throughout. Work a line of running stitches between all double lines before working the buttonhole; this acts as a padding and strengthens lines to be cut. Leaf veins are worked in slanting satin-stitch and dots are French knots. Press finished embroidery

for early morning tea



on wrong side under a damp cloth and cut away parts shown in photograph; do this very carefully, using sharp scissors.

Place back and front of cosy together, right sides facing, and machine round curved edge, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch outside line of buttonholing; trim to within $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch of the machining. Turn right side out; turn up hem round lower edge and slip hem.

With right side facing, shape shoulders by casting off 9 sts at beginning of next 4 rows; cast off remaining stitches.
With right side facing, rejoin wool to last 40 sts. Cast off 6, knit to end, then work to correspond with right front.

SLEEVES

With red wool and No. 12 needles, cast on 49 sts. and work 2 inches k. 1, p. 1 rib as before. Change to No. 9 needles and stocking-stitch, increasing at each end of 7th and every following 8th row until there are 61 sts. Work straight until sleeve measures 10 inches.

With right side facing, shape top by casting off 4 sts. at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at each end of every alternate row until 41 sts. remain, then at each end of every row until 23 sts. remain; cast off.

RIBBED BANDS

Join shoulder seams. With No. 12 needles and red wool, cast on 11 sts. and work a length in k. 1, p. 1 rib as before, to go up right front, when slightly stretched. Sew in position as you go along and leave stitches on a safety-pin at top.

Work a similar strip for left front with the addition of 7 buttonholes, 8th comes in neckband later. First comes $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch from bottom edge, 7th about $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch from top and remainder at equal intervals. Mark position of buttons on right front with pins, then work holes to correspond. To make a button-hole:—Rib 4, cast off 3, rib to end and back casting on 3 over those cast off.

Neck: With right side facing, No. 12 needles and red wool, rib 11 sts. from right front border, pick up and k. 77 sts. all round neck, rib remaining 11 sts. from left front border. Work 1 inch k. 1, p. 1 rib, making 8th buttonhole after $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch has been done. Cast off in rib.

TO MAKE UP

Press pieces on wrong side under a damp cloth. Join sleeve seams; insert sleeves. Sew on buttons; press all seams.

armhole edge and sew neatly. With right side facing and No. 11 needles, pick up and k. 106 sts. all round neck. Work 9 rows stocking-stitch, starting with a purl row. Cast off very loosely, using a bigger needle. Turn these rows under and catch down lightly on wrong side. Work a row of double crochet down each side of back opening, working through double band at neck. Work a second row down right side, making 4 button loops evenly spaced. Sew on buttons.

Trim shoulders with white braid as shown in photograph. Lines between scrolls are embroidered in chain-stitch, surrounded with French knots. Join side seams. Bind armholes on wrong side with petersham to keep firm. Press seams.

4-PLY JUMPER

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TO MAKE UP

Press work under a damp cloth, but ribbed yoke and sleeves only very lightly. Join side and sleeve seams. Pin yoke in position, then join shoulder seams and centre cast-off edge of yoke to back of neck. Sew yoke to cast-off edges on front and down sides; overlap ribbing at centre, right side over left, and sew through double thickness neatly to cast-off edge at centre. Insert sleeves. Press all seams.

Rejoin wool to remaining stitches at neck edge and work to correspond with first shoulder.

TO MAKE UP

Press parts well under damp cloth, avoiding ribbing. Join shoulder, side and under-arm seams. Work a row of double crochet all round neck and down each side of back opening, then work a second row on right side of opening, making 4 button loops. Work a row of d.c. in B. round right sleeve, and a row round left sleeve, using the appropriate wool for coloured bands. Sew on buttons. Press seams.

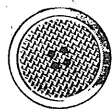
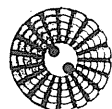
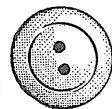
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
