



## EASY STITCHES FOR A CHIC JUMPER

**a quickly-worked  
jumper**

**M**OSS-STITCH and ribbing cleverly combine to make this a particularly charming jumper. The high neck buttoning down the back with small glass buttons is especially good for under your autumn suit. Instructions are given for both long and short sleeves.

**MATERIALS:** 7 ozs. "Halcyon," 4-ply (10 ozs. for long sleeves). Original uses flame, No. 5538. A pair No. 8 and a circular No. 10 needle; 5 small buttons; 1 press stud.

**MEASUREMENTS:** To fit 34-36-inch bust; length from top of shoulder, 18½ inches; sleeve seam, 6 or 18½ inches.

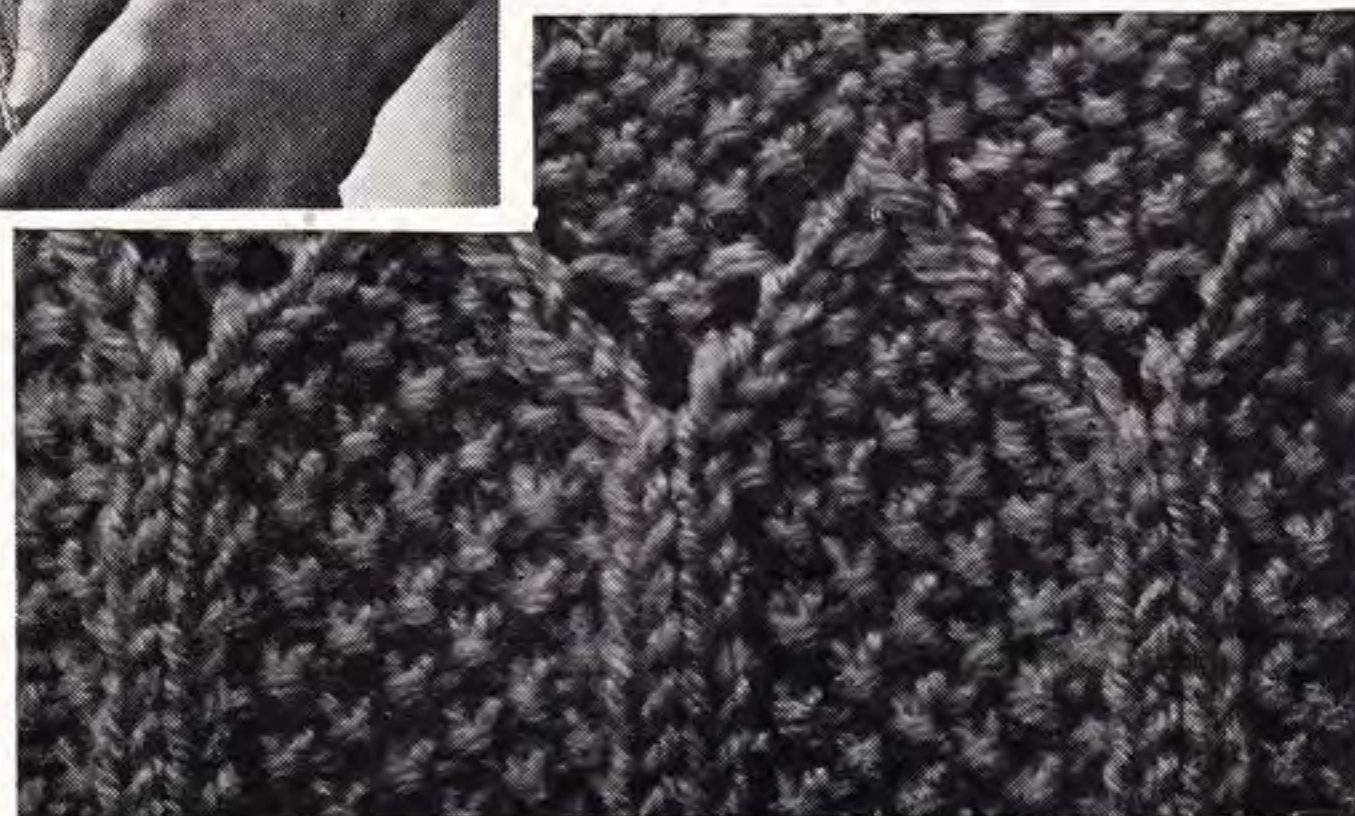
**TENSION:** 6 stitches to an inch, measured over the moss-stitch.

### BACK

With No. 10 needles cast on 90 stitches and work 3½ inches in k. 1, p. 1 rib. Change to 2 No. 8 needles and work as follows:—1ST ROW: \* (k. 1, p. 1) 4 times, k. 1; repeat from \* to end of row. 2ND ROW: \* p. 1, moss 7, p. 1; repeat from \* to end. Repeat these 2 rows until work measures 12½ inches from commencement. Here shape armholes. Cast off 10 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at beginning of next 8 rows. Leave these stitches on a spare needle.

### FRONT

With No. 10 needles cast on 108 stitches and work exactly as for back, leaving remaining stitches on a spare needle in the same way.



### SLEEVES

**Short:** With No. 10 needles cast on 72 stitches and work 1¼ inches in k. 1, p. 1 rib. Change to No. 8 needles and pattern, and work until sleeve measures 6 inches from commencement. Cast off 9 stitches at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at beginning of following 8 rows. Slip remaining stitches on to a spare needle.

**Long:** With No. 10 needles cast on 54 stitches and work 3 inches in k. 1, p. 1 rib. Change to No. 8 needles and pattern, increasing at each end of needle in every 8th row until 72 stitches are on the needle. Work straight until side edge measures 18½ inches, then shape top as given for short sleeve. Leave remaining stitches on a spare needle.

### YOKE

Now assemble the pieces. Work in pattern across back, one sleeve, front and second sleeve. Mark the beginning

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## TWO-PIECE FOR A GIRL OF FOURTEEN

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Continue this pattern, increasing 1 stitch at each end of the next and every following 8th row until there are 68 stitches on the needles. Cast off 25 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows, and then continue in pattern on remaining 18 stitches for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches. In the next 2 rows make a buttonhole. 1ST ROW: In pattern on first 7 stitches, cast off 4 stitches in pattern to end. 2ND ROW: Work in pattern, casting on 4 stitches to replace those cast off. Work  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch in pattern. Cast off.

Work a second cuff in the same way.

### COLLAR

With blue wool and No. 10 needles, cast on 18 stitches and repeat skirt pattern for 1 inch. In next 2 rows make a buttonhole. 1ST ROW: In pattern on first 7 stitches, cast off 4, in pattern to end. 2ND ROW: In pattern, casting on 4 stitches to replace those cast off. Work 1 more inch in pattern, ending with a row on the wrong side. Leave these stitches and work another piece in the same way, but end with a row on the right side, and at the end of this row cast on 162 stitches. Now, keeping in pattern, work the stitches from the spare needle on to the same needle (198 stitches). Continue for  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, and then change to No. 11 needles and work  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch more. Change to No. 12 needles and work a further  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch. Cast off.

### THE SKIRT

With blue wool and two No. 10 needles, cast on 218 stitches and work for  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch in k. 2, p. 2 rib, commencing every row with slip 1, and ending with k. 1. Change to pattern as follows:—

1ST ROW: Slip 1, \* k. 3, slip 1. Repeat from \* to last stitch, k. 1. 2ND ROW: Slip 1, \* slip 1 knitwise, keeping wool to front, p. 3. Repeat from \* to last stitch, k. 1. 3RD ROW: As 1st row. 4TH ROW: Slip 1, purl to last stitch, k. 1. 5TH ROW: Slip 1, \* k. 1, slip 1, k. 2. Repeat from \* to last stitch, k. 1. 6TH ROW: Slip 1, \* p. 2, slip 1 knitwise, keeping wool to front, p. 1. Repeat from \* to last stitch, k. 1. 7TH ROW: As 5th row. 8TH ROW: Slip 1, purl to last stitch, k. 1.

Repeat these 8 rows of pattern twice more. Now continue in pattern but decrease as follows:—1ST ROW: Work in pattern over first 70 stitches, k. 2 tog., work 74 in pattern, k. 2 tog., work to end. Work 7 more rows in pattern. 9TH ROW: Work 69 in pattern, k. 2 tog., work 74 in pattern, k. 2 tog., work to end. Continue in this manner, decreasing the side panels in every 8th row, but keeping the centre panels straight, until 158 stitches remain. Change to No. 11 needles and continue the decreases in every 6th row (instead of 8th row) until 138 stitches remain. Work in pattern for a further 2 inches without decreasing. Leave on a spare needle. Now work another piece in exactly the same way for back. Slip the stitches from the back and front on to the set of No. 12 needles (92 stitches on each of 3 needles), and work in rounds of k. 1, p. 1 rib for 2 inches. Cast off loosely in rib.

### TO MAKE UP

**Jumper:** Press pieces carefully, pressing out the ribbing at lower edge. Join side, shoulder and sleeve

seams and sew in sleeves. Join cuff, and attach to sleeve, matching side seams and cast-on edge to sleeve edge. Sew on collar, placing cast-off edge to neck, and edges to centre front. Sew on buttons to correspond with buttonholes. With blue wool, embroider a small arrow-head at the base of each shoulder dart.

**Skirt:** Press carefully: pressing out ribbing at hem. Sew up side seams. With a wool needle, thread the elastic at the waist, passing under one thread of each plain stitch. Work 9 rounds in this way, leaving 1 plain round between each. Draw up to the required tension, and fasten off firmly with sewing cotton.

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of back with a piece of coloured wool. Continue on the No. 10 circular needle.

1ST ROUND: \* Moss 2, k. 2 tog., m. 1, slip 1, k. 1, pass slipped stitch over, moss 3 (*i.e.*, the m. 1 comes between the 2 plain stitches); repeat from \* to end. 2ND ROUND: \* Moss 2, k. 3, moss 3; repeat from \* to end. 3RD ROUND: \* Moss 1, k. 2 tog., m. 1, moss 1, m. 1, sl. 1, k. 1, p.s.s.o., moss 2; repeat from \* to end.

4TH ROUND: \* Moss 1, k. 1, moss 3, k. 1, moss 2; repeat from \* to end. 5TH ROUND: \* k. 2 tog., m. 1, moss 3, m. 1, sl. 1, k. 1, p.s.s.o., moss 1; repeat from \* to end. 6TH ROUND: \* k. 1, moss 5, k. 1, moss 1; repeat from \* to end.

7TH ROUND: k. 1, \* m. 1, moss 5, m. 1, sl. 1, k. 2 tog., p.s.s.o.; repeat from \* to end. 8TH ROUND: Moss to last 2 stitches, k. 2 tog. Work next 4 rounds in moss-stitch.

13TH ROUND: (starting with a purl stitch): \* Moss 5, k. 3 tog., moss 8; repeat from \* to end. Work 4 rounds in moss-stitch.

Continue as follows:—Moss to centre of back, turn and moss back, casting on 4 stitches at end of row for button-flap. Still in moss-stitch work backwards and forwards for 3 more rows. 5TH ROW: (the side without underflap): Moss 2, cast off 2, \* moss 11, k. 3 tog.; repeat from \* to last 13 stitches, moss 13. 6TH ROW: Moss-stitch, but cast on 2 stitches to replace those cast off in previous row. Work 6 rows in moss-stitch.

13TH ROW: Moss 2, cast off 2, \* moss 9, k. 3 tog.; repeat from \* to last 13 stitches, moss 13. 14TH ROW: Moss-stitch, but cast on 2 to replace those cast off in previous row. Next 6 rows, moss-stitch. 21ST ROW: Moss 2, cast off 2, \* moss 7, k. 3 tog.; repeat from \* to last 13 stitches, moss 13. 22ND ROW: Moss-stitch, but cast on 2 to replace those cast off in previous row. Next 6 rows, moss-stitch.

29TH ROW: Moss 2, cast off 2 \* moss 5, k. 3 tog.; repeat from \* to last 13 stitches, moss 13. 30TH ROW: Moss-stitch, but cast on 2 to replace those cast off in previous row. Work 4 rows in moss-stitch.

Change to garter-stitch (plain knitting) and work 4 rows. 5TH ROW: k. 2, cast off 2, k. to end. 6TH ROW: k. but cast on 2 stitches to replace those cast off in previous row. Knit 2 more rows; cast off loosely.

### TO MAKE UP

Press work carefully under a damp cloth. Sew together side and sleeve seams. Stitch down button-flap and sew on buttons to correspond with buttonholes. Stitch press-stud just above the top button.
