



For GRANNY a smaller size for MUMMY

MATERIALS: 6 ozs. Patons Beehive Fingering, 3-ply, in a dark shade, and 1 oz. light contrasting wool for both sizes. A pair each No. 9 and No. 11 "Beehive" needles. Two buttons.

MEASUREMENTS: To fit 32-34 (36-38) inch bust; length from top of shoulders, 18½ (19½) inches; sleeve seam, 18½ (19½) inches.

TENSION: 7 sts. to an inch on No. 9 needles.

N.B.—Instructions in brackets for larger size.

BACK

With No. 11 needles, cast on 92 (106) sts. and work 4 inches in k. 2, p. 2 rib. Change to No. 9 needles and stocking-stitch, and increase at each end of next and every following 6th row until there are 118 (132) sts. Work straight until side edge measures

11½ (12) inches. Shape armholes by casting off 6 sts. at beginning of next 2 rows, then decrease at each end of every following alternate row until 90 (90) remain. Work straight until back measures 18 (19) inches, then shape shoulders by casting off 8 sts. at beginning of next 6 rows. Cast off.

FRONT

Work as for back until there are 118 (132) sts. on needle, ending with a purl row. Now start to introduce yoke:—k. 56 (63) dark, k. 6 light, k. 56 (63) dark, using a second ball of wool.

2ND ROW: Purl 56 (63) dark, k. 6 light, p. 56 (63) dark.

3RD ROW: k. 56 (63) dark, * k. 1 light, wind wool 3 times round needle, repeat from * 4 times, k. 1, k. 56 (63) dark.

4TH ROW: p. 56 (63) dark, * slip 1, drop the 3 made stitches, repeat from * until there are 6 long loops on right needle. Put point of left needle through first three loops and slip them over the last three, putting

them all on left needle, then k. 6, p. 56 (63) dark.

Continue thus for yoke, taking in 6 more dark sts. into light wool every 4th row, and shaping armholes as for back when side edge measures 11½ (12) inches. Continue until there are 15 lattice patterns across yoke. Work straight until front is same length as back, then shape shoulders by casting off 8 sts. at beginning of next 6 rows. Cast off loosely across front.

SLEEVES

With dark wool and No. 11 needles, cast on 54 sts. and work 3 inches in k. 2, p. 2 rib. Change to No. 9 needles and light wool and work in lattice pattern for 12 rows. Now join in a ball of dark wool and work first 6 sts. dark, centre sts. in light, and last 6 dark with another ball of wool.

Continue thus, working 6 more sts. in dark wool every 4th row, and at same time increasing at each end of every 4th row until there are 66 (72) sts., then at each end of every 6th row to 84 (90) sts. Work straight until side edge measures 18½ (19½) inches, then shape top by casting off

4 sts. at beginning of next 2 rows, then k. 2 tog. at each end of every alternate row until 32 remain. Cast off 3 sts. at beginning of next 4 rows. Cast off.

TO MAKE UP

Press work on wrong side under a damp cloth. Sew together side, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches of shoulder seams; insert sleeves, after joining seams. Work a row of double crochet round back and front of neck and shoulder openings, making a loop on each shoulder for buttons. Sew on buttons.

keeping 5 knit sts. each end of purl rows; on next row k. 7, * k. 6, k. 2 tog., repeat from * to last 12 sts., k. 12. Work 2 (6) more rows. Cast off.

SKIRT BACK AND FRONT ALIKE

With No. 9 needles, cast on 164 sts., but do *not* knit into backs, as loops are required for knitting up hem. Starting with a knit row, work 16 rows in stocking-stitch. Now fold work over with right side facing and knit up hem by working 1 st. from cast-on edge together with a st. from left-hand needle. Work 3 rows in stocking-stitch.

NEXT ROW: k. 23, k. 2 tog., k. 42, k. 2 tog., k. 26, k. 2 tog., k. 42, k. 2 tog., k. 23. Work 3 (5) more rows in stocking-stitch. **NEXT ROW:** k. 23, k. 2 tog., k. 40, k. 2 tog., k. 26, k. 2 tog., k. 40, k. 2 tog., k. 23. Work 3 (5) more rows in stocking-stitch. **NEXT ROW:** k. 23, k. 2 tog., k. 38, k. 2 tog., k. 26, k. 2 tog., k. 38, k. 2 tog., k. 23.

Continue thus, decreasing 4 sts. across every 4th (6th) row, keeping two end and centre panels straight, and working 2 sts. less between 1st and 2nd decreases and between 3rd and 4th decreases, until 80 remain. Work 3 (5) more rows. **NEXT ROW:** k. 23, (k. 2 tog.) twice, k. 26, (k. 2 tog.) twice, k. 23. Work 3 (5) more rows. **NEXT ROW:** k. 23, k. 2 tog., k. 26, k. 2 tog., k. 23. Work 6 rows. Cast off.

TO MAKE UP

Press pieces lightly under a damp cloth, avoiding ribbing. *Jumper:* Join shoulders. Sew up side and sleeve seams; insert sleeves. Sew fastener in front opening. Sew on collar, leaving $\frac{1}{2}$ inch free each side of zip-fastener. *Skirt:* Join side seams. Make $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch hem at waist and thread through elastic.

Use brown wool for nearly two-thirds, and fawn for remainder. Continue in this arrangement until centre hole is filled up. Trim to shape as diagram.

Pass a piece of strong thread through each boot-button shank. Pass ends of each through to back of head; knot each end from one eye to an end from other eye, making knots tight enough to be well hidden in pile. Make mouth with long brown stitches.

Ears: Make 4 ch. Working in d.c., do one row stitch into stitch, then 4 rows putting 4 sts. into each st., then one row with 2 into every alternate st. and one into st. between. Fasten off and stitch into position. Draw crochet work over foundation and stitch firmly in position.

TEDDY BEAR

Materials: A piece of material 18 by 36 inches wide. Scraps of dark brown for paws. Two buttons. **Transfer No. 266, price 7d. post-free in the United Kingdom from STITCHCRAFT Ltd., 188 High Holborn, London, W.C.1.**

Iron off transfer marked T (figure indicates number of each part required) and cut out in cloth, leaving turnings all round. Join the four body pieces, leaving neck open. Turn inside out and stuff tightly with bits of soft material. Next sew two halves and centre parts of head together, leaving opening at neck.

Pad very carefully, starting at nose, and correct shape as you go along.

Join ears together (each ear is cut out in 2 pieces), turn inside out and sew to head. Cut out arms and legs, join seams and pad evenly. Close openings after padding.

Before joining head and body at neck, pad both sides as tightly as possible to prevent head from moving, using strong buttonhole-thread, sew on arms and legs, pressing them against body. Cut four pads of a darker shade material and sew to inside ends of paws and base of feet. Eyes are brown boot buttons. Nose and claws are stitches in black wool.

FROG

Materials: Small amounts of green and white 3-ply Patons Beehive Fingering with a few yards of black wool or stranded cotton. A pair No. 13 "Beehive" 9-inch needles. Kapok or a few rags for stuffing.

Tension: 8 sts. to an inch.
