SIZE 16

MATERIALS: CHADWICK'S RED HEART SHETLAND FLOSS, 6 balls (1 oz. balls).

MILWARD'S PHANTOM KNITTING PINS, 1 pair No. 2 (2 $\frac{3}{4}$ mm. size) and 1 pair No. 3 (3 mm. size).

2 buttons.

Silk seam tape.

A pair of tailored shoulder pads.

MEASUREMENTS AFTER BLOCKING: Width across back at underarm—18 inches. Width across back at shoulder—14 inches. Width across each front at underarm—7 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches. Length from underarm to lower edge—7 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Length of sleeve, underarm seam—8 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Width of sleeve at underarm—13 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

GAUGE: 7 sts make 1 inch; 9 rows make 1 inch.

BACK . . . Starting at bottom, cast on 28 sts on No. 3 needles and work in stockinette st (k 1 row, p 1 row), casting on 11 sts at end of each row until there are 94 sts on needle. Work straight for 2 inches. Then inc. 1 st at both ends of next row and every 3rd row thereafter until there are 126 sts on needle. Work straight until piece measures 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches, measuring from last 11 cast-on sts.

TO SHAPE ARMHOLES: Bind off 8 sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Dec. 1 st at end of each row until 90 sts remain. Work straight until piece measures 9 inches from 1st row of armhole shaping. Bind off.

RIGHT FRONT . . . Starting at bottom, cast on 7 sts and p across. Cast on 7 sts. Now work in stockinette st, casting on 7 sts at end of each p row until there are 35 sts (cast-on edge is Front edge). Continue in stockinette st, increasing 1 st at front edge every other row twice, keeping opposite edge (underarm edge) straight—37 sts. **Next row:** Starting at front edge, make a buttonhole 3 sts in from edge—to make a buttonhole, on one row bind off 4 sts; on next row cast on 4 sts to replace those bound off. Continue in stockinette st, keeping underarm straight and increasing 1 st at front edge every 4th row 19 times in all but, when underarm measures 2 inches, inc. 1 st at underarm edge every 6th row 8 times in all. Continuing with front increases, work straight until underarm measures 8 inches.

TO SHAPE ARMHOLE: Starting at underarm edge, bind off 5 sts once; then dec. 1 st at armhole edge every other row 4 times in all. Keeping armhole edge straight, continue with front increases until there are 59 sts on needle. Work straight until piece measures 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches from 1st row of armhole shaping. Starting at armhole edge, bind off 38 sts and p across remaining 21 sts. **Next row:** K 21, cast on 24 sts (45 sts). Work straight for 2 more inches. Then, starting at front edge, bind off 10 sts, thus

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No. 1192 Illusion

MATERIALS: CHADWICK'S RED HEART BABY WOOL, 5 balls (1 oz. balls).

MILWARD'S PHANTOM KNITTING PINS, 1 pair No. 3 (3 mm. size) and 1 pair No. 5 (4 mm. size).

4 small buttons.

Crinoline shoulder pads.

MEASUREMENTS AFTER BLOCKING: Bust—36 inches. Width across back at underarm—18 inches. Width across back at shoulder—13 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Width across front at underarm—18 inches. Length from underarm to lower edge—11 inches. Length of sleeve, underarm seam—4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Width of sleeve at underarm—13 inches.

GAUGE: 7 sts make 1 inch; 10 rows make 1 inch.

BACK . . . Starting at bottom, with No. 5 needles cast on 95 sts. **1st row:** (Right side) * P 3, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3. **2nd row:** * K 3, p 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 3. **3rd row:** * P 3; into next st make k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1 and k 1; then p 3, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3; into next st make k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1 and k 1; then p 3. **4th row:** * K 3, p 5, k 3, p 1. Repeat from * across, ending with k 3, p 5, k 3. **5th row:** * P 3, k 5, p 3, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3, k 5, p 3. **6th row:** Same as 4th row. **7th row:** * P 3, p 5 tog., p 3, k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3, p 5 tog., p 3. **8th, 9th and 10th rows:** Repeat 2nd, 1st and 2nd rows. **11th row:** * P 3, k 1, p 3; into next st make k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1, and k 1. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3, k 1, p 3. **12th row:** * K 3, p 1, k 3, p 5. Repeat from * across, ending with k 3, p 1, k 3. **13th row:** * P 3, k 1, p 3, k 5. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3, k 1, p 3. **14th row:** Same as 12th row. **15th row:** * P 3, k 1, p 3, p 5 tog. Repeat from * across, ending with p 3, k 1, p 3. **16th row:** Same as 2nd row. These 16 rows constitute the pattern. Work in pattern until piece measures 3 inches; then inc. 1 st at both ends of next row and every 7th row thereafter until there are 113 sts on needle. Work straight until piece measures 11 inches.

TO SHAPE ARMHOLES: Bind off 7 sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Then dec. 1 st at end of each row until 85 sts remain. **Next row:** With right side toward you, work in pattern across 1st 39 sts, k 7, turn—thus starting center back opening. **Following row:** K 7, work in pattern across. Repeat these last 2 rows alternately 3 more times. Work in pattern, keeping the 7 sts at center back k sts and making a buttonhole 3 sts in from center back edge on next row and every 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches thereafter until 4 buttonholes in all are made—to make a buttonhole,

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starting neck shaping. Now dec. 1 st at neck edge every other row 9 times in all; at the same time inc. 1 st at armhole edge every 4th row 5 times in all (31 sts). Work straight until piece measures $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches from cast-on sts. Bind off. Make 3 pleats evenly apart across the bound-off edge at armhole, and sew cast-on edge in place over bound-off sts.

LEFT FRONT . . . Work as for Right Front, reversing shapings.

SLEEVES . . . Starting at bottom, cast on 80 sts and work in stockinette st, increasing 1 st at both ends of row after the 1st $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches and every inch thereafter until there are 94 sts on needle. Work straight until piece measures $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches in all. To shape top of sleeve, bind off 9 sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Dec. 1 st at end of each row until 56 sts remain. Now dec. 1 st at both ends of every 3rd row until 42 sts remain. Now bind off 3 sts at beginning of each row until 18 sts remain. Bind off.

BELT . . . Starting at short end, with No. 2 needles cast on 14 sts and work $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches in ribbing of k 1, p 1. Bind off. Sew seam tape to belt to prevent stretching.

Block all pieces through a damp cloth. Sew up underarm and shoulder seams. Sew up sleeve seams and sew in sleeves. Turn under $\frac{1}{4}$ inch on all edges of bolero, and sew seam tape on wrong side, holding in neck edge to measure 15 inches. Sew a button to belt $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in from each end. Fasten neck with hook and eye. Sew shoulder pads in place.

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sts on last row. Change to No. 5 needles and work in pattern as for Back, increasing 1 st at both ends of every 3rd row until there are 97 sts. Work straight until piece measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches in all. To shape top of sleeve, bind off 3 sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Dec. 1 st at end of each row until 39 sts remain. Bind off 4 sts at beginning of each row until 15 sts remain. Bind off.

COLLAR. Right Half . . . Starting at outer edge, with No. 3 needles cast on 48 sts and work $1\frac{3}{8}$ inches in ribbing of k 1, p 1. Then bind off 16 sts every other row until all sts are bound off (this to be neck edge). **Left Half . . .** Work to correspond with Right Half.

Sew up underarm and shoulder seams. Sew up sleeve seams and sew in sleeves, using extra fullness of sleeve to make 3 pleats at top. Sew collar to neck edge. Sew on buttons. Sew in shoulder pads.

No. 1191 Duckling

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SLEEVES . . . Starting at bottom, with No. 1 needles cast on 64 sts and work in ribbing for 1 inch. Change to No. 3 needles and work in pattern, increasing 1 st at end of each row until there are 94 sts on needle. Bind off 6 sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Then dec. 1 st at end of each row until 22 sts remain. Bind off.

Sew up underarm seams. Sew a zipper along each shoulder. Sew up sleeve seams and sew in sleeves, making 2 tucks at top.

General Information

GAUGE . . . Instructions for garments give a gauge or the number of stitches per inch. Therefore, always make a small sample about 2" x 3" using the thread and hook or needle specified and see that your gauge corresponds to that specified. If not, then determine if you work more loosely or tightly and use a finer or larger needle or hook.

SIZE ALTERATION . . . If your measurements vary from the standard sizes to a great extent, add the additional number of stitches and rows so that the completed garment is your specific size in inches. Try garment against yourself occasionally to be sure that you are keeping in with measurements.

TO LAUNDER WOOL GARMENTS . . . Before laundering, measure your garment carefully and record all necessary measurements. It is advisable to remove all detachable trimmings. Use a good neutral soap or soap flakes and make suds in warm water. Wash by squeezing the suds through the article. Do not rub. Then rinse two or three times in clear, lukewarm water and squeeze out.

Lay the garment out carefully on a Turkish towel and pull into shape according to the measurements taken previously. Pin with rust-proof pins to hold the outline desired. Do not stretch out any ribbing. Allow to remain until thoroughly dry. Never hang up, and do not place directly in the sun. If any pin marks or unevenness remain after drying, these can be pressed out with the iron.

IMPORTANT . . . Be sure to buy at one time sufficient material of the same dye lot to complete the garment you wish to make as it is impossible to avoid slight variations in color in different dye lots.
